1. Invitation

Parkstone Yacht Club invites competitors to enter the Moth Open Meeting to be held on Saturday/ Sunday, 12/13 June 2010. Visiting competitors/crew/guests are granted Temporary Honorary Membership for the duration of the event.

2. Organising Authority

The Organising Authority will be Parkstone Yacht Club.

3. Rules

- a. Racing will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing, the prescriptions of the RYA, this Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions and the International Moth Class Association rules.
- b. In the event of any conflict, the Sailing Instructions will prevail.
- c. The Sailing Instructions will be available at time of registration.
- d. Personal advertising will be permitted and competitors may be required to display event advertising. All advertising should comply with current ISAF regulations.

4. Entries

- a. The completed entry form must be submitted to Parkstone Yacht Club, Pearce Avenue, Poole, Dorset BH14 8EH, with the entry fee.
- b. The entry fee for the Open Meeting will be £30.
- c. Registration for all competitors will be at Parkstone Yacht Club from 0900 hrs on Saturday 12th June 2010.

5. Competitors Briefing

A briefing for competitors will take place in the Clubhouse at 10.00 hrs on Saturday 12th June 2010

6. Eligibility

No boat may take part in the event without a current measurement certificate.

7. Racing

- a. Racing will take place in Poole Harbour using fixed and laid race marks.
- b. Course details, with a description of marks, will be set out in the Sailing Instructions.
- c. Courses will be Windward/Leeward.
Course information will be displayed on the Committee Boat before the start of each race.
- d. Up to six races are scheduled. The races will be sailed back to back with three races on Saturday and three on Sunday. Any races missed on the Saturday may be added to the program for Sunday.
- e. The warning signal for the first race will be at 11.55 hrs on Saturday. Race 2 will take place asap after the previous race. The warning signal for the first race on Sunday will be at 10.55 hrs. Further races will take place asap after the previous races.

8. Scoring

- a. The event will be scored in accordance with RRS Appendix A, using the Low Points system.
- b. One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.
- c. One discard will be applied when three races have been sailed.

9. Prizes

- a. The 1st prize will be awarded to the overall winner.
- b. Additional prizes will be at the discretion of the Race Committee having regard to the number of boats entered.
- c. The prize giving will take place as soon as possible after racing on Sunday.
